

Submission Guidelines:

- Papers on the listed themes must be sent by email to smfconf10@gmail.com
- Paper must be in either Microsoft Word or RTF file format; hard copies will not be accepted.
- Papers must be written in English.
- Your submission should include a separate page containing:
 - Title of paper
 - Suggested topic and sub-theme
 - Name(s) of authors
 - Affiliation
 - Full postal address, telephone, fax and e-mail address
- Authors' names should be on the title page only, in order to facilitate the blind refereeing process.
- Papers and abstracts will only be accepted for review on the condition that the manuscript has not been copyrighted, has not been published, has not been presented or accepted for presentation at a professional meeting, and is not currently under review for presentation at another professional meeting. A declaration to this effect must accompany the final paper in the format given at <http://www.iimahd.ernet.in/smfconf/submissionofpapers.php>
- Authors must intend to register for, and attend, the conference to present the paper if it is accepted.
- All accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings, provided completed papers are received by the appropriate deadline and conform to the format and length requirements.

Manuscript preparation

- The manuscript must be typed, single-spaced (including indented material, notes, and references). All headings including title should be 12 point in New Times Roman while text should be 10 point New Times Roman. Margins must be of 1 inch on all sides.
- Papers should not exceed ten pages.
- Abstracts should be of maximum 300 words.
- Follow the mentioned order when typing manuscripts: Title, Authors, Affiliations, Abstract, Keywords, Main text, Acknowledgements, Appendix and References.
- All photographs, charts and diagrams are to be referred to as "Figure(s)" and should be numbered (in Arabic numerals) consecutively in the order to which they are referred. Tables should be numbered consecutively in the text in Arabic numerals.
- Metric units are preferred and should be used wherever appropriate.
- List of references must be arranged in alphabetical order.
- For text citations, papers should be referred to as (Jain 2004) and papers by the same author in the same year should be distinguished by lettering in sequence (2004a, 2004b, etc.) Where papers are not by more than three authors, all names should be cited, otherwise the first name followed by 'et al.'
- References should be given in the following form:
